

This three-part funder toolkit, developed by NFG's Integrated Rural Strategies Group, is designed to support funders in expanding their grantmaking to support rural organizing. Whether you are a national or place-based funder or whether you are looking to initiate funding to rural communities or deepen your existing rural grantmaking to build organizing capacity, this toolkit is for you.

Self-Assessment

The Rural Organizing Funder Assessment was created to help foundations assess the degree to which their funding strategies and practices align with the needs of rural organizers. The

Assessment consists of 30 questions and can be used for self-reflection, as a grantmaking program assessment, or as a 360-degree review across various stakeholder groups such as your board, staff, and grantees. This tool is a direct response to rural organizers' needs and feedback to the philanthropic sector, as captured in our report: Resourcing Rural Organizing Infrastructure: A New York Case Study.

Action Planning Guide

The Rural Organizing Funder Action Planning Guide is a tool to help funders proactively plan to deepen their impact. Using the Guide, funders can identify specific actions that can be taken over 3-month, 1-year, and 3-year timeframes to improve the Foundation's grantmaking strategy and operational practices when funding rural organizing.

Resource Library

Available on NFG's website, the Rural Organizing Funder Resource Library is intended to become a one-stop-shop for resources, case studies, program models, and learning opportunities for funders who support rural community organizing in their grantmaking. The Resource Library will serve as a centralized repository of IRSG's learning over time as our members increase their work in resourcing rural organizing.
